Covid-19 pandemic.
Lemon Tree Hotels, which had to let go of several employees by the end of the second wave, plans to hire about 1,500 people over the rest of the year with the opening of 20 upcoming hotels and to add manpower to its existing hotels, said Patu Keswani, chairman and managing director. Earlier, in Q3, the leading hotel chain had hired 1,500

as travel had resumed post se-cond wave. Royal Orchid and Regenta Hotels will hire 1,000 people as it expands to new markets and cities and adds 100

markets and cities and adds 100 hotels in its portfolio in 2022.

"We have stepped up our hiring efforts across the group, from entry level to senior positions. Hiring today at our group has been recovery led," said Chander K Baljee, chairman, Royal Orchid and Regenta Hotels.
