## Lupin

Lupin has received approval from China's National Medical Products Administration for its Abbreviated New Drug Application for Oseltamivir Phosphate, developed with Yabao Pharmaceuticals. The approval marks Lupin's first product launch in China. The company plans to introduce the Oseltamivir Phosphate oral suspension for paediatric use, expanding its international pharmaceutical footprint.

## L&T

Larsen & Toubro has secured multiple significant orders valued between ₹1,000 crore and ₹2,500 crore. The contracts include piling works for the JSW Utkal Steel project, EPC contracts from the Inland Waterways Authority of India, and development of a yacht marina project in Mumbai, strengthening its infrastructure and construction order book.

## Acme Solar

Acme Solar has signed a 300 MW/1,200 MWh Firm and Dispatchable Renewable Energy power purchase agreement with SECI. The project will supply power at ₹6.28 per unit over a 25-year period. The agreement strengthens Acme Solar's renewable energy portfolio and supports India's clean energy transition goals.

## Adani Green

Adani Green Energy has commissioned the world's largest battery energy storage system outside China, with a capacity of 3.37 GWh. The project significantly enhances renewable energy integration and grid stability while reinforcing the company's position as a leading player in large-scale clean energy and storage infrastructure.

## Zydus Lifesciences

Zydus Lifesciences has revised its share buyback price upward to ₹1,260 per share from ₹1,150. While the total buyback size remains unchanged at ₹1,100 crore, the number of shares proposed for repurchase has been reduced to 87.30 lakh, reflecting the higher offer price and capital allocation strategy.

## Wipro

Wipro has expanded its partnership with ServiceNow to accelerate adoption of agentic AI workflows across enterprises. The

collaboration aims to automate and enhance operations in key functions including IT, human resources, procurement and cybersecurity, helping clients improve productivity, decision-making and digital transformation outcomes through artificial intelligence.

## Bharat Electronics

Bharat Electronics has received additional orders worth ₹608 crore since May 5. The contracts cover communication equipment, avionics, coastal surveillance radar systems, seekers, jammers, tank subsystems, simulators, medical electronics, batteries, spares and services. The latest wins further strengthen the defence PSU's robust order pipeline.

## LG Electronics

LG Electronics is eligible to receive incentives worth ₹705.74 crore from the Maharashtra government under the state's Electronics Policy. The incentives relate to the expansion of the company's manufacturing facilities at Pune and Ranjangaon, supporting investments aimed at boosting production capacity and local electronics manufacturing.

## Lemon Tree Hotels

Lemon Tree Hotels has signed a new 66-room property in Kumbakonam, Tamil Nadu, further expanding its presence in South India. The hotel will be managed by Carnation Hotels, the company's wholly owned subsidiary. The addition aligns with Lemon Tree's strategy of strengthening its footprint across key leisure and business destinations.

## Ashok Leyland

Ashok Leyland reported record quarterly and annual revenue, profit and commercial vehicle sales for FY26. The strong performance was driven by healthy domestic demand, rising exports, growth in the aftermarket business and improving traction in electric mobility, highlighting the company's strengthening position in the commercial vehicle segment.

## Inox Green Energy

Inox Green Energy Services reported a sharp rise in consolidated net profit to ₹28.35 crore in the March quarter from ₹6.44 crore a year earlier. Total income increased to ₹119.48 crore from ₹85.30 crore, supported by business growth. The company remains one of India's leading wind power operation and maintenance service providers.
